Did you know you can apply for grants from the Association to help with projects you may want to run but cannot finance?



Skills Training Day

Following the success of the last Training Day at Heyside last year, we've booked again to hold our annual Skills Training Day. Please book your place asap, courses are filling up and they are open to the rest of the Brigade Nationwide.

It will become mandatory for all Companies to have a First Aider present at all meeting nights soon and it is recommended that you have people trained in Food Hygiene when preparing food or refreshments. **ARE YOU COVERED?** If not book on the courses we are offering. Food Hygiene is an on-line course which we are hosting, but equally, you could do it in your own time at home. We can provide you will a licence for the course.

Also, if you need to complete your training assessment to get a Certificate of Leadership from NHQ, book a session with one of our assessors during the day. The short interview to discuss your level of experience will be all that's needed. You need to complete an APEL form and bring it with you.

Regimental Returns and Fees

All CO's should have received the forms for their Annual return of Company numbers, Training records and Regimental fees. We have held our fees at 50p for Martins and £1 for all others again this year. Please ensure they are returned as soon as possible as we are already past the due date.

Brigade's Membership System (BMS) and NHQ returns

This month has seen a major innovation in the Brigades record keeping. The Brigade Membership System has been developed by our resident geek, (sorry Computer expert) Jason Greenwood at NHQ to record all our Leaders and members in order to satisfy our Insurers requirements. The system is in-house, secure and no-one outside Brigade will have access to your data. Only our CO's or their appointed and approved representative will be able to access the data for your Company. Only NHQ can commission Officers or register helpers. In future, Battalion and Regimental CO's will be able to access those CO's below them and Staff Officers on their team.

The system is there for you to use as much or a little as you need as long as you fulfill the minimum requirements and at the end of the day it will do your returns for you. If you have any questions take a look at the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) on -line, speak to NHQ or ask me. I am sure you'll get an answer from one of us.


Skating at Spinningfields
