THE CHURCH LADS' BRIGADE

(Prior to January 1892 the new organisation was run from the C.E.T.S. office in Church House, Westminster.)

1934 (June)

St. Margaret's Rectory, Ironmonger Lane, London. E.C.2 (Formerly the HQ of the LDCLB)

1939 (September)

Northolt Road, South Harrow, Middx. (Temporary move to Roxeth & Harrow Co. HQ. for the duration of the war)

NB. From 10th June 1940 the name changed to 'National HQ'.
