This year is the 30th anniversary of Volunteers' Week and it's time to celebrate!

Here are some ideas and resources to get you started...

### What's it all about?

During Volunteers' Week hundreds of events will be taking place across the country to say thank you to volunteers, recognising the important contribution they make.

Please join us in saying thank you to the volunteers who make our society a better place, and in highlighting the many different ways that people can get involved.

## **Celebrating 30 Years**

This year also marks the **30 years** since the campaign was established in 1984.

To recognise the 30th anniversary we are using the number 30 as a hook and theme for the week.

Be creative with the number and your activity ideas.

Recognise the contribution your volunteers make, whether it's 30 seconds, 30 minutes, 30 hours, 30 days or even 30 years!

Highlight the range of opportunities to get involved in volunteering, even if you only have a little time to spare. You might want to consider trying micro-volunteering. Check out our micro-volunteering guidance.

#### Offer 30 minute taster sessions

This will provide an opportunity for people to try out volunteering for the first time, or existing volunteers might want to try a different role. Celebrate 30 years of your organisation

#### Hold an event

# Hold an awards ceremony for your volunteers

Holding an awards ceremony is a great way to recognise the achievements and contribution your volunteers make.

## Launch a new project

If you are about to start a new volunteering project, launch it during Volunteers' Week.

Make sure you have information about what the project is about available, as well as how people can get involved as volunteers.

### Hold a recruitment event

Volunteers' Week is a good time to generate interest in volunteering, highlight the benefits and show how your volunteers help you to achieve your mission.

Running events in new locations might help to attract people who wouldn't usually hear about your organisation or volunteer for you.

Look for local events and recruitment fairs you might be able to join if you cant hold your own event.

## **Invite your MP**

Volunteers' Week is an ideal time to showcase what your organisation is doing and the contribution your volunteers make.

Consider other key stakeholders in your local area that you might want to invite to celebrate with you. Prepare an invitation list early on so you can get the date of your event in people's diaries.

You can use our template letter to invite them and read our top five tips for inviting your MP on the next page.

### Five tips for inviting your MP

- 1. Find your local MP on the <u>Parliament website by entering the</u> <u>postcode</u> of your organisation. If you click through to their profile, this will also give you all their contact details.
- 2. It is up to you whether to send the invitation by letter or by email. Just make sure you include your postcode, either at the top of the letter or as part of the subject line of the email. This helps them identify you as a constituent as shown on our template invitation.
- 3. It can take MPs' offices a while to respond as they receive so much post. However, if you have not heard from them after two or three weeks, you might want to call them to check they have seen the invitation.

- 4. Events on Fridays are usually best for MPs because Parliament does not sit on Fridays and they spend the day in their constituencies. Thursday evenings and Monday mornings can also be good options.
- 5. Local MPs like to attend events that are also photo opportunities, which they can use with the local press or on their own blogs. Think about what suitable activities they could do with your organisation or which volunteers they might be interested to meet.

## Logos and branding

You can download the Volunteers' Week logos including the special 30 years anniversary logo for 2014.

You can also use the 30 years badge independently.

Our templates in this pack suggest how you might wish to use the logo – use these as a guide.

## Publicising your event

Get in touch with your local media to tell them about your event using our press release template.

Put your event on the Volunteers' Week map. The map will show how volunteers are being thanked across the country.

We can help to promote what is happening locally and help people to find your event. We will also be highlight events taking place to local media, and we can include your event.
